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## Cultural Arts

We had our PTA sponsored first Cultural Arts Assembly of the year titled "Classical Hip-Hop", by Christylez Bacon on Monday, November 24th, for all students at Cedar Grove Elementary. This program merged the contrasting worlds of Classical music and Hip-Hop music, in a collaborative musical program featuring GRAMMY nominated Progressive Hip-Hop artist Christylez Bacon (pronounced: Chris-styles) and six-string electric cellist, Wytold (William Wytold Lebing). Traditional elements of hip-hop such as human beatbox, rhyming and storytelling are blended with classical compositions of composers like Bach, Vivaldi, and Pachelbel. Christylez Bacon will demonstrate the amazing human beat-box, and how it can interplay with the percussive and bowing techniques of the electric cello. By building cross-cultural connections, these presentations help students gain insight into the universality of artistic expression. Students will have learned about the elements of improvisation and ensemble performance and explore a range of tone qualities, rhythms, and musical genres. The program will demonstrate how music can be created using the most basic materials of the artist's own voice and body, in addition to using modern-day acoustic engineering technology. Christylez Bacon & Wytold are long time favorites and distinguished artists with the Music Center at Strathmore, the National Cathedral, and the Kennedy Center. We truly hope that your students both learned from and enjoyed this fun & unique Assembly! 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## Media Moments

We are absolutely thrilled to announce that our grade 3, 4, AND 5 classes now have their chrome books and are quickly becoming acquainted with various apps to help them during the school day. I'm sure you've heard a lot of chatter from your child about this amazing new technology, and we encourage you to make discoveries together as we learn how to use this exciting tool to enhance instruction in the classroom.

Circulation in the media center is high, thanks to my parent volunteers. Just to give you a snapshot: from October 1 through November 20 we circulated 8,016 books to our students. The media center is rarely closed, because I can count on my ladies to ensure that our students can read for pleasure.

Our inquiry projects for the second marking period are in full swing, and it's delightful to be part of the discovery that's occurring during the student research.

**Kindergarten** is in the midst of its Goldfish research. We have created a Graphic Organizer on *Kidspiration* to capture all the facts that we are learning from our various resources. The next step is to start taking notes from our *PebbleGo* Goldfish article, by highlighting key words and phrases.

**First grade's** focus on Tomie DePaola, and how he uses his strong connections to his family and his experiences in life to create ideas and write his stories, is in progress. We are journaling responses to his four stories, and will proceed with the biographical research after we've captured some information about his life that we predict is true based on his stories.

**Second grade's** research of a different country to get information about the sensory details we can use in our narratives is almost complete. We have used our print resources as well as *Culturegrams* and *Imagequest* to get as many facts as we can so our new folk tale setting will be as authentic as possible. We are also going to learn how to record our stories, after we've written our scripts.

**Third grade's** lessons in the media center are almost complete. The chrome books have been wonderful, allowing us to extend our research to Mrs. Hirschhorn's [pathfinder](#)

on the media page. We have researched the evolution of various technologies, and are now inferring what that technology will look like and do in the future. More importantly, we are making connections to what we want by way of technology as opposed to what we need.

**Fourth graders** are extremely excited about their inquiry project. The fact that they are involved in researching elements of their community and can use their chrome books to create a survey on *GoogleForms*, is very engaging. We've spent quite a bit of time investigating the demographics of Clarksburg as well as existing types of businesses so that with the information we get from our survey, we will be able to make an educated decision about what kind of business Clarksburg can still absorb.

**Fifth grade's** inquiry focus is an awakening for many of our students. By focusing on the various events of The Civil Rights Movement, our students are learning to appreciate the sacrifices that people make in order to make changes in government and therefore in the quality of their lives. We are using print resources of all kinds, including primary resources from the Newseum, as well as our Web and video resources. Our chrome books are helping us in the research process, giving us access to those online resources without having to wait for access to the computer lab.

We are already on our second news crew. My first crew was wonderful, and I know my second crew will be wonderful, too. Please feel free to access our [daily news show](#) on our Web page. I try to keep up and upload the show within 24 hours.

Our *I Wonder* question box is still in the media center to support the Science Expo. We encourage our students to contribute by creating a method to find an answer to that question. As always, we read a few student-created methods on the TV news every Friday.

Lastly, as we all anticipate the Winter holidays, and I make ready to travel to Los Angeles to celebrate Hanukkah, Christmas, and family with my children, I hope you all have a wonderful Winter break with lots of laughter and outside play and, above all, the time to curl up with a good book.
