Cultural information and artifacts.





## Media Moments

Unbelievably, in spite of all of our snow days, we have started our third marking period – which means new inquiry projects for the media center for every grade level. The media schedule is packed with classes and I'm excited about getting started.

To complement the science content in the classroom, Kindergarten will be researching and comparing two living things. We will begin with what we know about mealworms/darkling beetles and add to our knowledge through our research. Then we will research the butterfly to compare and contrast to the mealworm. We will be working on creating questions; taking notes; reading for information; evaluating our information and sharing that information.

First grade will be studying natural and man-made land features as well as natural resources by researching the American regions, specifically a state in that region. We want to know how the differences in these regions affect how we live and work. I will model researching the state of Maryland and then students will do independent research based on the state of their choice within a specific region. We will use text features in print and online resources to help us gather information and learn about these elements of our vast and varied country!

Second grade is going to answer the question, "How does a natural or human-caused change affect the way people live, work, or play?" by researching both man-made and natural changes. We will have our classes in groups and use print and online resources to learn about the changes in the seasons, trees, the telephone, the light bulb, or the car. We will also explore how changes can be both good and bad.

Third grade is investigating how authors get their ideas and how an illustrator portrays real or imagined experiences. This project, which is directly connected with the writing process, will end with the students writing and illustrating their own realistic fiction picture book. So in the media center, we will be integrating the Social Studies content, studying how people adapt to different regions around the world – the mountains, the Rainforest, the Savannah, the Arctic/Polar, and the desert. We will research one region which will become the setting in our realistic fiction story. In addition, we are using the academic skill of risk-taking and the creative skill of originality this marking period, and encourage you to support your children as they learn these skills.

Fourth grade is going to continue their exciting venture into investigating their community by researching how media messages are created and produce consumers. They will discover the different media message techniques, which we know will allow our students to evaluate advertisements and commercials more critically. You may never be able to watch a commercial with your fourth grader the same way again! Then they will create an ad for the business the students researched last marking period to be included into the Clarksburg master plan.

Fifth grade is tasked with writing a narrative in any genre but, as we know, all stories must have a strong believable element to keep the reader hooked. Therefore, again

integrating another content area (this time Science), we will research the solar system. We will compare the earth with another planet and use the information we locate to create a realistic setting for our story.

Our second TV News Crew has completed its shift, and we have changed to the third crew of the year. It takes a few days, but they are getting into the routine of the morning news show. I will be planning our 5<sup>th</sup> grade spring book club and sending out applications soon, so be on the look-out for those!

Last but not least, I want to again thank my parent volunteers – my Library Ladies – for always being there for us. You sign up on *SignUpGenius* and simply show up and make my mornings and afternoons. For the month of January (through January 24) we circulated 3, 238 books to students. Do you remember how many school days we had in January? Do you have any idea how wonderful this is? I do! So, thank you!
